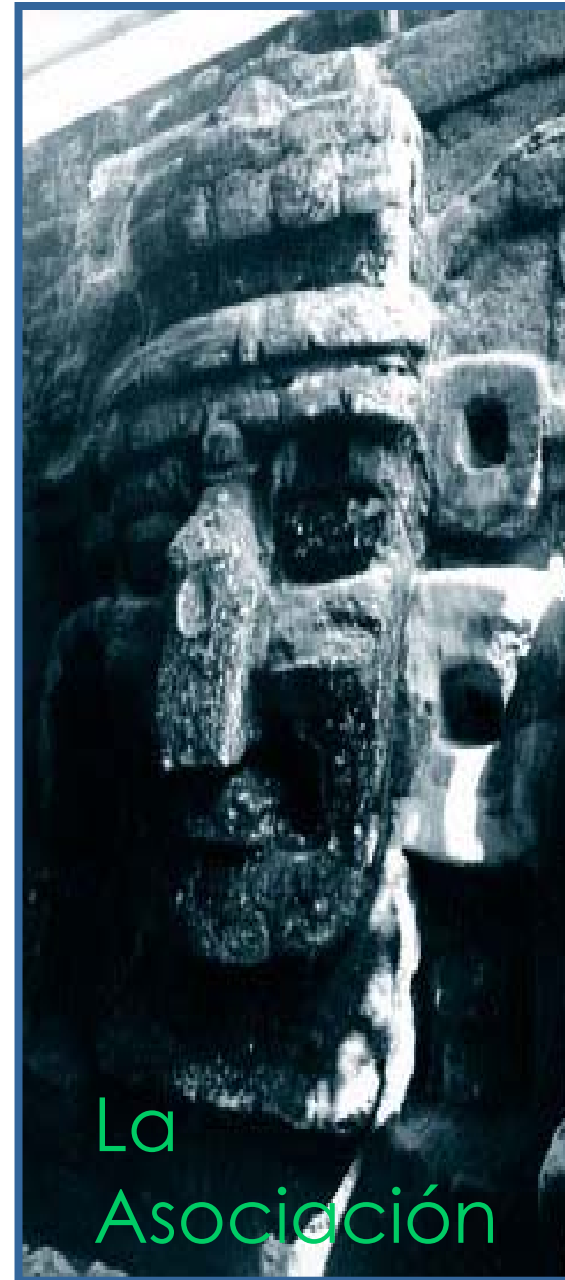

Our goal in designing this program is to complement traditional language study by bringing



students into direct and more focused contact with different aspects of Guatemalan life, such as the history, customs and traditions that have been preserved from our past and that continue to shape our present. La Asociación POP WUJ provides:

- One-on-one classes
- Families (room and board throughout students stay in Quetzaltenango)
- Contacts

- Translation services during lectures and other activities

The program does NOT provide:

- The cost of meals on the assorted trips
- Admission costs at the parks: TIKAL or ABAJ TAKALIK
- Airfare to/from Guatemala from/to US, Canada, or Europe

Total Cost of the Special Program:

- \$1000 per person
- Minimum number of participants: 10 persons

Students receive certificates of participation for the Special Program.
